MIN 01/07/08/2025: PRELIMINARIES

The meeting commenced at 10:05 a.m. with a word of prayer led by **Ms. Ruth Achieng**, followed by introductions by all members present. The **Municipal Manager** welcomed participants and thanked them for continued engagement in municipal planning processes. He emphasized that the meeting was a follow-up to the public participation forum held on **29th May 2025** and aimed at confirming agreed priorities and discussing implementation arrangements.

MIN 02/07/08/2025: CONFIRMATION OF FY 2025/2026 PRIORITY PROJECTS

The Municipal Manager presented a summary of resolutions from the previous public participation meeting. Participants were reminded that two projects had been unanimously prioritized under the municipal development budget for FY 2025/2026, namely:

- Acquisition and development of a dumpsite
- Upgrading of Onanda Market

Participants confirmed that the priorities reflected community needs and were consistent with the **Homa Bay County Fiscal Strategy Paper 2025**.

It was unanimously resolved that the two projects remain the **officially endorsed priority projects** for implementation in FY 2025/2026.

MIN 03/07/08/2025: BUDGET ALIGNMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINES

The **Chief Officer – Budget and Economic Planning** informed the meeting that discussions with the County Assembly regarding enhancement of the municipal development allocation were ongoing. Participants were updated that planning would proceed based on the projected **KShs. 15 million allocation**, subject to final approval.

The Municipal Engineer and Environment Officer outlined proposed implementation timelines as follows:

- **Dumpsite acquisition and development:**
 - Site identification and due diligence – Q1
 - Land acquisition and fencing – Q2
 - Installation of gate, weighbridge, and security block – Q3
- **Upgrading of Onanda Market:**
 - Levelling works – Q2
 - Installation of gates – Q3

Participants emphasized the need for transparency during procurement and implementation to avoid delays and stalled projects.

MIN 04/07/08/2025: GRIEVANCE REDRESS AND STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK

The Municipal Social Development Officer briefed the meeting on the **Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)**, including reporting channels and response timelines.

Participants were encouraged to submit any concerns related to project siting, land acquisition, or construction impacts through the established GRM. It was agreed that GRM updates would be a standing agenda item in all subsequent public engagement forums.

MIN 05/07/08/2025: ANY OTHER BUSINESS (AOB)

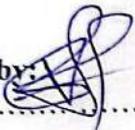
A participant requested that future engagements include targeted forums for traders affected by the Onanda Market upgrading works.

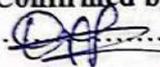
Another member proposed that environmental awareness sessions be conducted for communities living near the proposed dumpsite site to enhance acceptance and cooperation.

MIN 01/06/11/2025: PRELIMINARIES

The meeting commenced at **10:00 AM** with a word of prayer followed by self-introductions by all participants present.

The **Municipal Manager** welcomed participants and appreciated members of the public, civil society representatives, youth, women, and persons with disabilities for attending the forum. He emphasized that the meeting aimed to gather public views on **social, environmental, and public health matters** in line with the **Constitution of Kenya (2010)** and **World Bank Environmental and Social Framework (ESF)**.

MIN 02/06/11/2025: SOCIAL ISSUES AFFECTING OYUGIS MUNICIPALITY

Participants discussed various social concerns affecting the municipality. Key issues raised included:

- Inclusion of **youth, women, and persons with disabilities** in municipal programs and employment opportunities
- Need for improved **street lighting** to enhance safety and reduce crime
- Youth unemployment and the need for skills development initiatives
- Gender-based violence (GBV) awareness and referral mechanisms
- Need for recreational facilities and safe public spaces

Resolutions:

- The municipality to strengthen stakeholder engagement targeting vulnerable groups
- Youth and women groups to be linked to municipal livelihood and skills programs
- Safety concerns to be coordinated with relevant county departments

MIN 03/06/11/2025: ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT ISSUES

The meeting discussed environmental challenges facing Oyugis Municipality, including:

- Poor solid waste management and illegal dumping
- Environmental risks associated with dumpsite operations
- Need for waste segregation and recycling initiatives
- Flooding due to blocked drainage systems
- Urban greening and tree planting

Resolutions:

- Community sensitization on proper waste disposal to be enhanced
- Environmental safeguards to be observed in all municipal projects
- Partnerships with private sector and community groups to support waste management and greening initiatives

MIN 04/06/11/2025: PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY ISSUES

Participants deliberated on public health matters and safety concerns, including:

- Sanitation and hygiene conditions in markets and public spaces
- Food safety standards in markets and eateries
- Access to clean water and functional public toilets
- Fire safety preparedness and emergency response
- Occupational health and safety for waste handlers and municipal workers

Resolutions:

- Regular public health inspections to be strengthened

- Hygiene promotion and disease prevention campaigns to be conducted
- Fire safety awareness and emergency preparedness to be prioritized

MIN 05/06/11/2025: GRIEVANCE REDRESS MECHANISM (GRM) AND ACCOUNTABILITY

The Municipal Manager informed participants about the existing **Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)** for handling complaints related to municipal services and development projects.

Participants raised concerns about:

- Limited public awareness of GRM channels
- Delays in feedback on reported grievances

Resolutions:

- GRM information to be widely disseminated through notice boards and public forums
- All grievances to be recorded, tracked, and responded to within stipulated timelines
- Regular reporting on grievances received and resolved

MIN 06/06/11/2025: ANY OTHER BUSINESS (AOB)

Under AOB, participants proposed:

- Establishment of a municipal stadium and public cemetery
- Increased community participation in environmental conservation activities

The Municipal Manager noted the proposals and advised that they would be considered during future planning processes.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:00PM with a word of prayer.

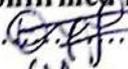

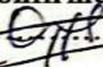

1. Meeting Objective

The objective of the meeting was to conduct an open, inclusive, and participatory **Stakeholder Engagement** forum for:

- Identification of priority infrastructure and service delivery projects under KUSP II (UDG);
- Communication on the status of the initially proposed 0.3 km road construction project;
- Reprioritization of the proposed project following budget review and cost estimation;
- Participatory ranking and prioritization of alternative eligible projects;
- Agreement on priority investment areas and indicative budget allocation;
- Validation and approval of final priority project(s) for further technical feasibility, environmental and social safeguards screening;
- Consideration and approval of the revised Oyugis Municipality Local Physical and Land Use Development Plan (LPLUDP) and Oyugis Municipality Integrated Development Plan (IDeP).

The forum was conducted in line with:

- County public participation requirements;
- KUSP II Programme Operations Manual;
- Oyugis Municipality Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP);
- World Bank Environmental and Social Standard 10 (ESS10).

2. Participation and Representation

A total of 111 stakeholders attended, drawn from diverse sectors within Oyugis Municipality.

4. Proceedings Summary

4.1 Opening Remarks

The Municipal Manager welcomed participants and emphasized the requirement for **community-driven, transparent, and fiscally realistic project selection** under KUSP II.

Key points included:

- Only projects eligible under KUSP II (UDG) can be financed;
- Projects must be fully implementable within the allocated budget;
- Partial implementation of infrastructure projects is discouraged;
- Stakeholder validation is mandatory, particularly where reprioritization is necessary.

4.2 Program Brief – KUSP II Investment Window

The Municipal Planner presented:

- KUSP II objectives, focusing on strengthening urban institutions, infrastructure, and service delivery;
- Eligible investment sectors, including street lighting, solid waste management, drainage, markets, roads, NMT facilities, and public spaces;
- UDG funding ceilings and the importance of realistic project sizing;
- Environmental and social screening requirements, including ESMP preparation and continuous stakeholder engagement.

5. Status of the Initially Proposed 0.3 km Road Project

- The Municipal Engineer informed participants that the 0.3 km road along Onanda Street had undergone preliminary cost estimation.
- Estimated costs exceeded the allocated UDG budget, and partial construction was not technically or economically viable.
- The technical team recommended reprioritization to alternative projects that could be fully implemented within budget.

6. Community Project Proposals Raised

Following reprioritization discussions, stakeholders proposed:

1. Solar street lighting for Onanda Street and Market
2. Improvement of solid waste collection points (waste skips)
3. Rehabilitation of selected urban access roads (future phase)
4. Improvement of drainage along flood-prone streets
5. Construction of public sanitation facilities
6. Development of pedestrian walkways within the CBD

7. Stakeholder Justifications

7.1 Solar Street Lighting

- Poor lighting contributes to insecurity;
- Supports night economy and extended business hours;
- Solar lighting is sustainable and cost-effective;
- Fully implementable within UDG budget.

7.2 Solid Waste Management (Skips)

- Improves CBD cleanliness;
- Reduces public health risks;
- Complements street lighting for improved urban livability.

12. Consideration and Approval of Revised IDeP & LPLUDP

- **The Chairperson informed stakeholders** that the revised Integrated Development Plan (IDeP) and Local Physical and Land Use Development Plan (LPLUDP) had been prepared and were presented for consideration.
- Stakeholders were **taken through the key revisions**, including updated spatial planning, land use zoning, infrastructure priorities, and medium-term investment programming.
- Following deliberations, the forum **considered and approved the revised IDeP and LPLUDP**, recognizing their importance for guiding municipal development and aligning public and private sector investments.

- Stakeholders acknowledged that the approved plans provide a predictable planning environment for project implementation under KUSP II and future development interventions.

13. Final Stakeholder Resolution

- Approved final priority project package:
 - Solar Street Lighting – 80%
 - Solid Waste Management – 20%
- The revised IDeP and LPLUDP were **considered, deliberated, and approved**.
- Reprioritization of the road project was acknowledged as necessary, participatory, and justified.

14. Key Agreements

- Municipality to proceed with approved project package;
- Continuous stakeholder engagement throughout implementation;
- GRM to remain operational;
- Road construction to be reconsidered in future funding cycles;
- Stakeholders and private actors to align investments with approved revised IDeP and LPLUDP.

MIN 01/29/05/2025: PRELIMINARIES.

The meeting started with a word of prayer from Mr. Asah Oyamo at 14:15hrs followed by introductions from the members present.

The Municipal Manager welcomed everyone onboard and appreciated all for heeding to his call to attend the public participation.

He further appreciated the guests from the Headquarters for their efforts to make it to Oyugis Municipality.

MIN 02/29/05/2025: BUDGET PRIORITY AREAS FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2025/2026:

The facilitators advised members to have and list all the priorities then make a budget for the municipality that will run for a year. The manager and his team were further urged to foresee on what to do with the funds.

Dr. Simon discouraged and cautioned on the squandering of project money since this has led to stalled and unfinished projects and instead advised on incorporating other stakeholders to advise further.

The Chief Officer, Budget and Economic Planning informed the participants that the priority projects for FY 2025/2026 should come from the areas already prioritized in the Homa Bay Fiscal Strategy Paper 2025 as stated below:

- Installation of street lights.
- Acquisition of land for dumpsite.
- Construction of Market Stalls.
- Planting of Ornamental trees.
- Installation of Coded litter bins.

The manager highlighted on the World Bank's KISIP has done the following:

- High mast mounted solar lighting.
- Tarmacking a road at a 1000 street.

The manager updated members that the municipality had met KUSP 2 minimum conditions and performance standards and awaiting disbursement of funds

In addition, the manager brought to everyone's attention the Board members' proposal of purchasing a skip loader/waste tract and installing streets lights under KUSP UDG for the current financial year.

The participants noted that In the 2025/2026 financial year, Oyugis Municipality has been allocated a development budget of ksh 4,928,977 million (excluding 20 million for KUSP 2). However the chief officer for Economic Planning informed the participants that he will liaise with the assembly to increase the allocation to Ksh. 15 million. Thus the participants planned with Ksh. 15 million.

In the FY 2025/2026, the participants prioritized the following broader areas:

- i. Street lights.
- ii. Flyover (Nyamira junction towards the market).
- iii. Acquisition and development of land for the dumpsite.
- iv. Coded litter bins.
- v. Solar system backup in the market.

- Fire station.
- ii. Upgrading Onanda Market.
- viii. Sewer line within the CBD.
- ix. Development of spiral staircase at the main market stalls.

It was unanimously agreed that ornamental trees and coded litter bins can be done through partnership.

Participants unanimously agreed that sewer line, fire station, and fly-over required significant financial investment hence was not viable under the proposed budget. They were also not prioritized in the Homa Bay Fiscal Strategy Paper 2025 hence could not be prioritized.

The participants were informed that the solar lights had already been prioritized by the Board members under KUSP 2 for the current financial year (2024/2025).

Consequently, the participants **UNANIMOUSLY** agreed to prioritize the following **two** projects under the municipal development budget for the financial year 2025/2026:

Participants agreed that the ksh.10, 000,000 for dumpsite would include acquisition of land, fencing, installation of a gate, installation of a weighbridge, and construction of a security block. These developments were necessary to enhance the security of those living around the proposed dumpsite.

Participants noted that acquisition of land for dumpsite was an ineligible project under KUSP 2 hence was necessary to undertake the project under the municipal development budget provided by the county government.

The participants agreed that the ksh. 5,000,000 for upgrading of Onanda Market would cater leveling and installation of gates.

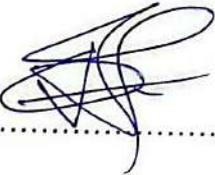

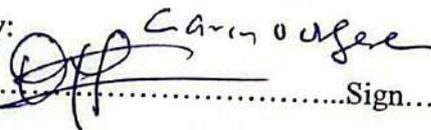
A member proposed that there is need for Oyugis to have a municipality stadium and cemetery as these would generate more income and revenue to the county as a whole.
