RUMA NATIONAL PARK

Ruma National park is located in lambwe valley homabay county.

The park covers 120 sq km.it was garzeted in 1966 as lambwe valley national reserve and later in 1983 it acquired the status of a national park. The vegetation is savannah grass, woodland with extensive accacia thickets. The fence covers 128km. The park has the following wildlife species;

- Black and white rhinos
- Roan antelopes
- Nubian giraffes
- Buffalos
- Heart beast
- Topi
- Oribi
- Water buck
- Zebra
- Several species of snakes
- Bushbuck
- Olive boboon
- Vervet monkeys
- Indeginous places

The park received 5313 visitors in 2019 but due to covid 19 the number of visitors declined to 1327 2020 and 2976 in 2021. Due to intensive marketing by the county government of homabay during the just concluded roan antelope Marathon the number of visitors increased rapidly to 3000 monthly.

KIT MIKAYI



Kit Mikayi, a Unesco listed heritage site lies approximately 30 Kilometres from Kisumu City. Kit Mikayi is a 70-metre-high gravity defying rock formation of large rocks balancing on each other with a cave underneath. Kit Mikayi “the stone of the first wife” in Dholuo, the widely spoken language in the region has the folklore that in the past, an elderly man named Ngeso had a great love for the natural stone monument. Every morning, Ngeso would go and lie in the cave under the rock all day. He was so fascinated and consumed by this stone that his wife would often bring his breakfast, lunch, and dinner to him as he lay in the cave around the stone, or on the stone itself. He ate most of his meals there. The story goes that, one day, someone asked Ngeso’s wife where he was; the wife replied that he was at the “first wife” in reference to the stone, because he spent so much of his time at the monument and loved it very much.

Enjoy Kisumu’s rich heritage!

THIMLICH OHINGA

Thimlich Ohinga Archaeological Site Situated north-west of the town of Migori, in the Lake Victoria region, this dry-stone walled settlement was probably built in the 16th century CE. The Ohinga (i.e. settlement) seems to have served as a fort for communities and livestock, but also defined social entities and relationships linked to lineage. Thimlich Ohinga is the largest and best preserved of these traditional enclosures. It is an exceptional example of the tradition of massive dry-stone walled enclosures, typical of the first pastoral communities in the Lake Victoria Basin, which persisted from the 16th to the mid-20th century.

GOT RAMOGI

Got Ramogi, the cradle of Luo dispersion
The family tree of Luo ancestry rests on Ramogi Ajuang' who is acknowledged to have arrived and settled at the foot of Got Ramogi forest. It is widely believed that the Luos moved from southern Sudan through Uganda, from the 14th to the 16th Century and settled in Kenya under different leaderships such as: Joka Jok, Joka Owiny, and Joka Omolo. This makes Got Ramogi forest to be an important cradle for Luo settlement in Kenya.

Ramogi Hills has always occupied a special place in the history of the Luo. The name Ramogi is not only equated to the hill as a physical feature— it is the name of the forefather of the Luo people.

Got-Ramogi is a hill of multiple purposes and significance ranging from cultural, religious and for the archaeologist; it is a historical site rich in traditional artifacts which indicates early life of people. Ramogi hills symbolize the heritage of the Luo Community.
