INTRODUCTION

What is Public Participation in the Context of Homa Bay County?

The public participation process entails an interaction between the Homa Bay County government and the public (including stakeholders and organized groups) aimed at making acceptable, better and informed decisions. The process involves informing and listening, dialogue, debate and analysis, and implementation of agreed solutions for socio-economic transformation in line with the **Genowa** Agenda.

Key Legal Frameworks for Public Participation in Budget Review Implementation FY 2023/24 and Budget Estimates for FY 2024/25

The involvement of the public in planning/formulation, implementation, and oversight is anchored on the following provisions:

- a) Sovereign power which belongs to the people and can be exercised either directly through citizen participation or indirectly through democratically elected leaders.¹
- b) National values and principles of governance include public participation as underscored in Article 10 of the Constitution.
- c) Right to participate in decision-making is guaranteed specifically under Articles 118(1) (b) and 196(1) (b) of the Constitution and directs the national and county legislatures to respectively “facilitate public participation” in their work. This underscores the fact that the election of representatives does not negate the need for people to continuously be involved in governance processes.
- d) Equality - Article 27 of the Constitution guarantees equal participation in decision making processes including the legislative activities.
- e) Freedom of Expression - the freedom of expression including the freedom to seek, receive or impart information or ideas including during public participation processes is guaranteed under Article 33 of the Constitution of Kenya.
- f) Right to access information - Article 35 of the Constitution as well as the Access to Information Act, No. 31 of 2016 guarantee every citizen the right to access information held by the State and its agencies.
- g) Sec. 117(a) of the PFM Act, 2012, mandate County government to involve the public, interested groups, and any other organized forums established by legislation for a public participation in all budget and planning processes.

THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE PUBLIC

Why Public Participation in the Budget Review Implementation FY 2023/2024?

The importance of public participation is captured in Article 118 of the GoK and other provisions of the law, which mandates any government agency to ‘facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other businesses which have a direct and indirect impact on the public. As a county, one of our core values is the pursuit of broader public participation in decision-making processes and policy formulation for sustainable development.

Involving the residents of Homa County in planning, policy-making, and implementation strengthens and deepens good governance for unlocking our endless potential. Additionally, public participation enhances transparency, accountability, and ownership of County government agendas and programs. Further, this is part of our commitment to ensuring time and adequate public access to information and participation in decision-making processes as well as oversight.

Therefore, meaningfully engaging the public in Budget Implementation Review, resulted in citizen empowerment; the generation of new, diverse and innovative ideas and actions; enhancement of citizen-government relations; the legitimation of government programs, appropriate prioritization of projects; improved delivery of public services and; government’s responsiveness.

METHODOLOGY

Pursuant to the PFMA 2012 (Sections 128 and 129), the County Government of Homa Bay, through the County Treasury in the process of preparing the Budget Estimates for FY 2024/25 and the MTEF period. Consequently, as guided by Article 201(a) and 232 (d) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, Section 87 of the county government act 2012, section 125 (2) and Section 137(3) of PFMA 2012. In complying with the aforementioned, the County Treasury, in coordination with the Department of Governance, Administration, Communication and Devolution invited the representations from the public, interested groups, stakeholders, special interest groups, civil society organizations, and youth for consultative forums on the annual budget estimates for FY 2024/25. This public engagement was held from 16th to 19th of April 2024 at the Sub-County meeting venues from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm.

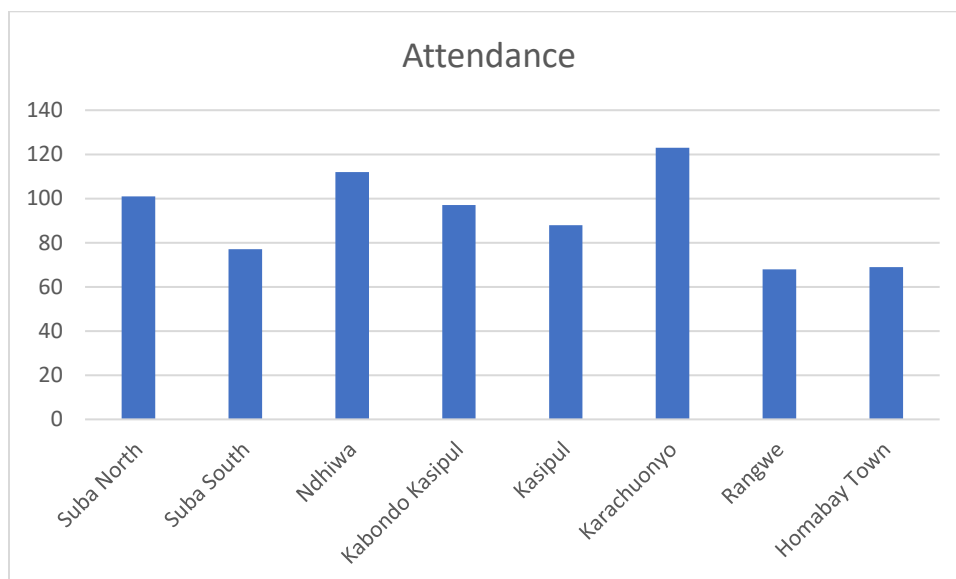
The PFM Act 2012 provides for public participation in County Governance processes with an emphasis on involving stakeholders during the preparation of county policies, plans, laws and assessing county performance. Consequently, the development of this report involved wide stakeholder consultations, including sector consultations, public hearings, and the County Budget and Economic Forum. Effort was made to expand engagement and enhance collaboration towards development of a sound fiscal framework and guided prioritization of expenditure. The stakeholders were from the various sectors that had long been profiled by the responsible departments to realize greater synergy through joint planning and integrated implementation, monitoring, and evaluation were targeted for the invitation. These included implementing partners, facility managers, civil society, unions and user groups. This engagement on budget estimates was made public on *The Standard* newspaper publication of April 5, 2024 (page 20). Further, it was circulated publicized in various social media platforms and county website.

Public consultations began with introductions and climate setting followed by a review of objectives and highlights of the draft document facilitated by officers of the Directorate of Economic Planning and Budget, followed by an opening remark from the Sub County admins. Afterwards, presentations were made by representatives of various county government entities where they expounded on their mandates, and achievements over the last year(s), including policies, citizens engaged/empowered, service delivery innovations introduced, projects implemented, issues to be addressed and the relevant key result areas, resource requirements and measures to enhance the fiscal space. Apart from presentations, other methods of engagement used included, group discussions (Ward-based), plenaries, questions and answer sessions, which were moderated by Ward Admins with help of

officers from the Directorate of Economic Planning and Budget. Besides brainstorming sessions, views, thoughts, and opinions received by the County Treasury in the form of written memoranda, received through email and the suggestion box, have also been considered in the various sector reports. Besides, written submissions or memoranda shall be received at the venue or can be emailed through finance@homabay.go.ke or mailed **P.O. Box 469-40300 Homa Bay** or be handed to the Sub-County or Ward Administrators' Offices before or on 19th April 2024.

REPRESENTATION

To ensure fairness and equity in the representation, the stakeholders/public were purposively sampled from the various village clusters. This approach ensured diversity in gender, age, regional balance, and religious perspectives. Consequently, there was a fair representation of people abled differently, women, youths, retired and practicing professionals, opinion leaders, CSO networks and their leadership, state officers, and marginalized groups. During this public participation, the turnout was 1,150 made of 735 public and 415 technical staff drawn from various county entities/departments.



CONCLUSION

In sum, the public participation for the Annual Budget Estimate FY 2024/25, adhered to both constitutional and county public participation guidelines as stipulated under the various provisions of the law. This 4-day exercise was conducted in all 40 wards across the County with forums being held at the 8 sub-county headquarters. In the process, a total of 1,150 stakeholders, representing all eight sectors and special interest groups were engaged. They were purposively sampled to ensure equity, fairness, and adequate representation. Importantly, the 2025 public participation about the budget was founded on the fiscal frameworks, CIDP 2023-2027, C-ADP 2024/25, MTP IV, and BETA agenda.
